Guide Description

AUTHOR NOTE: A little bit off the beaten path, Hilton Head features luxurious accommodations that you can find at few islands on the east coast. You'll find few bed and breakfasts and inns on the island, but what you find is a variety of resort hotels with amenities to please all the senses. Although the island is known for its rising luxurious hotels and resorts, Hilton Head also includes a couple quaint options. If you're looking for the typical southern accommodations, you may consider a couple inns that are in the area, including the Rose Hill Plantation in Bluffton or Hilton Head's Main Street Inn. Although they both are bed and breakfast style accommodations, they offer some of the same amenities you would have at a resort, including swimming and golf.

Choosing the right Hilton Head hotel often comes down to price and amenities. Many of the rising hotels offer many of the same features, including easy beach access and plenty of activities, but it's just a matter of which one appeals to your taste. You'll find many of the big name hotels on Hilton Head Island, including the Westin and Hilton hotels, as well as ones that are privately owned. Of course most of the resorts include plenty of golf, since that is what the island has built a reputation for. Other amenities at the many Hilton Head Island resort hotels range from restaurants to shopping to spas and even equestrian centers. There's something for everyone.

DESCRIPTION: Don't expect cozy Americana from this small, luxurious inn, as it's grander and more European in its motifs than its name would imply. Designed like a small-scale villa that you might expect to see in the south of France, it was built in 1996 in a format that combines design elements from both New Orleans and Charleston, including cast-iron balustrades and a formal semitropical garden where guests are encouraged to indulge in afternoon tea. Inside, you'll find artfully clipped topiary, French Provincial furnishings, and accommodations that are more luxurious and more richly appointed than those of any other hotel in Hilton Head. Overall, despite a location that requires a drive to the nearest beach, the hotel provides a luxe alternative to the less-personalized megahotels that lie nearby. © Frommer's

Hilton Head Snapshot

Local Info

Hilton Head Island is one of the most popular vacation spots on the East Coast. mostly because the place maintains its natural island scenery(and golf courses) and pristine white-sand beaches. Visitors can relax while enjoying the many island activities, which include biking, kayaking, parasailing and trails for leisurely hikes. Many travelers also appreciate tours of Hilton Head's many historic landmarks, particularly its old homes and its scenic harbor.

Sights

A good way to get an overview of the island is aboard a Red Trolley Tour, which wends around the historic sites and nature spots. Or hit the water on one of the many cruises that embark regularly from various marinas around the island. If you have kids along, they'll be kept busy at the Sandbox interactive museum, which features a lot of fun stuff to do, like the airport terminal area, where they can fly their own plane. Or check out the Coastal Discovery Museum and learn about the natural history and cultural heritage of the Lowcountry. Another interesting destination is Harbour Town, where you can stroll around the marina and see the yachts at anchor-- or rent your own jet ski, if you're in an energetic mood. This is also where you'll find the historic lighthouse and its accompanying museum. Coligny Circle has a nice beach. Shelter Cove Harbour has fireworks on Tuesday nights and Old Town Bluffton has a lot of historic buildings and many art galleries.

Dining and Nightlife

Hilton Head is well stocked with restaurants, both upscale and casual. Try to find a place that specializes in Lowcounty cuisine, which focuses on seafood with a Southern spin. Harbour Town has a broad selection of restaurants, as does Shelter Cove. Like any tourist destination, the island has a lively nightlife scene, with a busy bunch of clubs and live music venues. The vibe here tends to be on the

low-key side. The southern end of the island around Park Plaza is known as the "Barmuda Triangle." Harbour Town has regular outdoor performances that are often family-friendly.

Shopping

The upscale Mall at Shelter Cove is the only indoor mall on Hilton Head. It's not huge but it offers a wide selection of highend brands and specialty shops, as well as Belk, which is the only department store on the island. Coligny Plaza is another good retail location, with a variety of trendy boutiques, specialty and gift stores and its own theater. Harbour Town has a lot of galleries and gift shops within a short and scenic walk of each other. The Beach Market in "downtown" Hilton Head has a lot of tourist-centric shops where you can pick up a souvenir of your stay. © NileGuide

History

The history of Hilton Head reads like a thumbnail of the history of the United States. Originally inhabited by Native Americans, it was "discovered" by Europeans who quickly began exploiting its natural resources. Slaves were brought in to work the land, which was fertile and promising. After the Civil War. racial inequality remained troubling for generations, until modernization gave way to new ways of thinking and new hope for the future.

Early History: Explorations& **Plantations**

Though the Spanish had made previous inroads toward negotiating with native tribes and moving into the area, it was not until Captain William Hilton of Great Britain ventured into the region in 1663 that true settlement would begin. And begin it did, with a vengeance. Over the next century, the whole region became a hotbed of shipbuilding and agriculture. The island's dense live oak forests were turned into

ships, while slaves worked the nearly twodozen plantations.

Revolution& War: Strategic Stronghold

With production skyrocketing, it was only natural that Hilton Head's strategic importance gained notice. During the American Revolution, the island was but the first stop on England's furious house-burning rampage toward the more metropolitan Charleston. A similar course of events transpired during the War of 1812. Come the Civil War era, Hilton Head's value was not lost on the Union either. A 13,000troop force was deployed onto the island to subdue the Confederate defenses and free the slaves.

Reconstruction& the Rise of the Gullah

Like elsewhere throughout the Americas, it became apparent that the freeing of a formerly enslaved workforce came with a number of headaches. Racial and economic inequality plagued the island and its inhabitants for most of the next century. That said, a silver lining did emerge. Due to the region's (and, in particular, the island's) relative geographic and climatic isolation, the former slaves maintained a much stronger connection to their African roots than any other black population in the country. This truth persists to the present day, both linguistically and culturally.

The Modern Era: Building Bridges

Hilton Head, as it exists today, continues to exemplify the American experience. In the 1940s, some cunning entrepreneur recognized that Hilton Head was being wasted as an agricultural community. 1956 saw the construction of the first bridge to the island, extending Highway 278 from the mainland onto Hilton Head and ushering in the age of the resort. Over the course of the next few decades, the island's plantations were transformed into ultraluxurious playgrounds for the well heeled. Golf courses replaced the rice fields and shopping districts took over the shipping centers. Just as Native Americans inhabited Hilton Head seasonally 10 millennia ago, modern Americans(some as noteworthy



as Michael Jordan and John Mellencamp) summer here to this day, basking in the comfort and amenities. Hilton Head is truly the poshest of the posh.

From art galleries to jazz clubs, the city is brimming with the Eastern Seaboard's Low Country culture.

Get Your Groove On

Hilton Head is home to a vibrant music scene, as each night many of the bars and restaurants feature live performances in a variety of genres, from jazz to classic rock. The stage at The Jazz Corner draws some of the top names in the industry, providing guests with unforgettable entertainment while they dine. When you feel like rocking out to your old favorites, head to Montego Bay for lively dancing and tunes performed by the restaurant's house band. Antonio's laid-back lounge is home to a range of talented local jazz artists, and its intimate setting make it an ideal spot for a romantic date.

After Hours

Though the streets of downtown Hilton Head are lined with boutiques and specialty shops, the nightlife scene there is by no means lacking. Murphy's Irish Pub is a local favorite because of its quality brews, appetizing pub-grub, and authentic atmosphere. All you cigar aficionados will enjoy the stogie socials at Crane's Tavern after 9:30p. When sports, steaks, and beer are on the mind, head to Callahan's Sports Bar and Grill to catch all the excitement. With pool tables, foosball, and multiple TV sets for your viewing pleasure, this bar is a haven for sports fans island-wide.

Art for Art's Sake

For the art-lovers out there, Hilton Head is brimming with small locally-owned galleries that celebrate the island spirit. The Hilton Head Art League features the work of both prominent and up-and-coming artists, as

well as offering workshops and seminars to the aspiring artist in everyone. If this does not sate your appetite, Arts Center of Coastal Carolina showcases the work of local artists, while also offering a full season of theater performances and cultural events that are not to be missed. After checking out these exhibits, head to Smith Galleries to pick up a reasonably-pricedobject d'art for yourself. From prints to paperweights, this colorful shop is a tour through the world of contemporary American art, and a great spot to buy that last-minute gift.

Hit the Streets

When the crowds on the beaches near the downtown shopping district of Coligny Plaza become too oppressive, head north to Fish Haul Creek Park, where you can walk among the Spanish moss and ancient live oaks. If you are in the mood for a bike ride, Hilton Head is covered with an extensive network of paths, providing easy access to hot spots like Coligny Beach and Jarvis Creek Park. The natural beauty of Hilton Head can be seen across the island as long as you don't mind sidestepping a few manicured lawns here and there.

Tee Off

If golf is your game, Hilton Head is the name of the game. Tee up, tee off, and tee-lightful is the order of your Hilton Head day on the more than a dozen world-class courses. Many large clubs, like Golden Bear Golf Club at Indigo Run and Port Royal Golf and Racquet Club, offer lessons and workshops to help visitors improve their game(under the tutelage of famous professionals, nonetheless). If you do not take the illustrious game so seriously as that, forget the big resorts and head to Pirate's Adventure Island Golf for a swashbuckling good time with the family. Decked out in pirate's garb, you can put the other scurvy dogs in your party to shame with your mad"adventure golf" skills.

Things to Do Insights

Ocean Excursions

At Hilton Head, it's all about the water. So lovers of surf. sand and sun will find their passion met. Whether you're into cruises, snorkeling, deep-sea fishing, shark hunting, or all of the above, the island jewel of South Carolina has tours for anyone and everyone. At Broad Creek Marina. check out the S.S. Pelican Dolphin& Nature Cruise, where sea-animal lovers can regularly spot a veritable menagerie of their favorite critters. Ready your camera for the likes of sea turtles, brown pelicans, egrets of all kinds, otters, minks, and, of course, dolphins. Those eager for more excitement would want to sign up with Triple Threat Sport Fishing& Thrill Rides. Patrons here can book a speedboat and race along the waves, leaving leisure cruisers all wet. They also provide kite fishing, fly-fishing, shark fishing and more.

For those with kids and who want more of a nature theme to their fun, head to South Beach Village and join Commander Zodiac! Zodiac provides nature excursions where the whole family can get up close to Hilton Head's local fauna. With Kid's Waterfun Day, parents can drop off the kids for a fully supervised morning of boat rides, crabbing, swimming and more.

Nature Outings

Speaking of nature themes, Hilton Head loves its delicate ecosystem and invites visitors to feel the same. Commune with nature at Pinckney Island's national wildlife refuge by signing up for the Pinckney Island Walking Tour. Available each Thursday, participants can view the lush forest and marshes while learning about the area's fascinating history.

Much of Hilton Head's stunning nature is best appreciated paddling down a river in a kayak. Paddlers can feast their eyes on the dense and lively landscape while tour guides describe the delicacy and diversity of the local coastal waterways. Nearby Bluffton offers a fowl-filled extravaganza with the Eco-Birding Kayak Tour while paddling up the May River. The Coastal Creatures of Bull Creek Kayak Tour offers a six-hour educational trip down Bull Creek, and Live OAC(Outdoor Adventure



Company) offers a plethora of nature-filled and educational boating tours. Plantation Haven

This being the South, what vacation would be complete without a plantation tour? Though plantations may have once been thriving institutions, most have fallen into disrepair. Take the Fish Haul Tabby Ruins, now a shadow of its former glory. The Sea Island Plantation Overview takes visitors to the ruins and describes in detail the economy that once flourished and the crops grown. The Honey Horn Plantation, on the other hand, has the distinction of being the only intact plantation on the island. Attend a tour of the home and grounds and learn about its lengthy past. For more of an overview of Hilton Head's heritage, Low Country Adventures, provides bus tours that show off the local ruins and abandoned rice fields, ending at the Harbour Town Lighthouse landmark.

After about 18 miles you will reach the bridge to Hilton Head, at which point if you are heading to the Southern end of the Island(Shipyard, Coligny, Forest Beach, Sea Pines) stay to the left and use the expressway to save time and gas(\$1 toll). For all other destinations continue on I-278.
